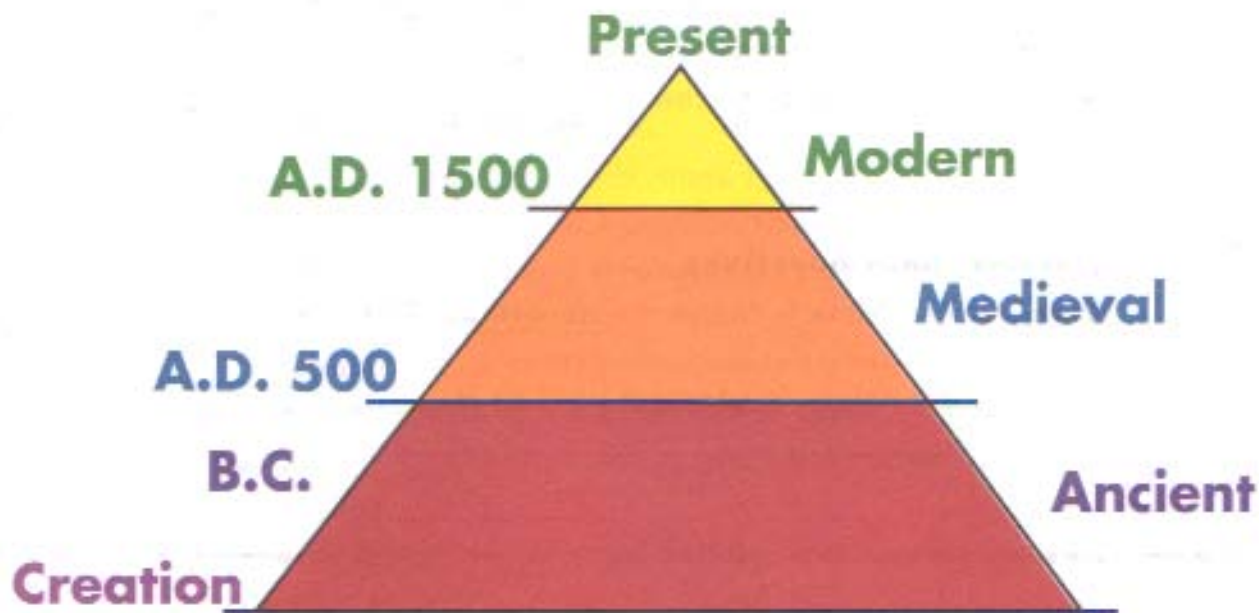


Historians also divide history into three **ancient**, **medieval**, and **modern** periods. These three periods are called **history**.



Periods in History

One of the least accurate ways of naming the periods of history has been by naming the periods after the material that man used for his tools or weapons: for example, the stone age, the jet age, and the atomic age. A real problem with

naming them this way is that not all civilizations progressed at the same rate; therefore, some civilizations were in the atomic age while others were still in the stone age.

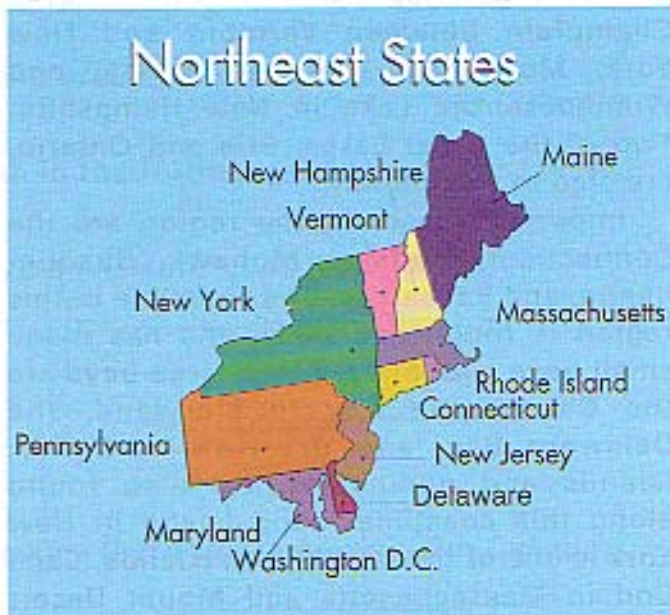

NORTHEAST

The Northeast was one of the first areas of the United States to be explored by Europeans. The Vikings explored parts of this region almost one thousand years ago. Later, Cabot sailed along the eastern coast and claimed the area around New York for the Dutch, naming it New Holland.

The states in the Northeast region are Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont. Washington D.C., our nation's capital, is also considered a part of the Northeast. Connecticut, Maine, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, and Vermont are called the New England states.
