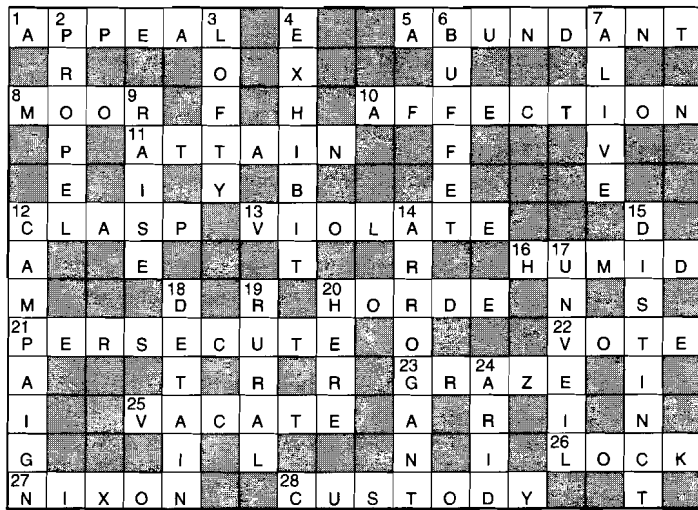

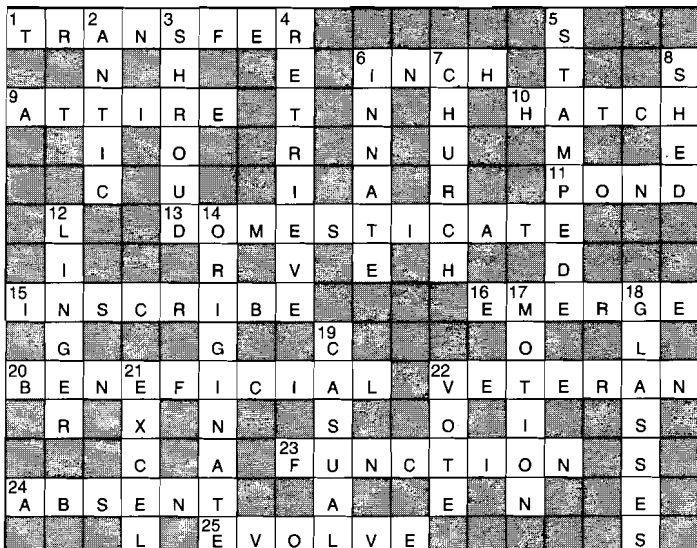
## Crossword Puzzle

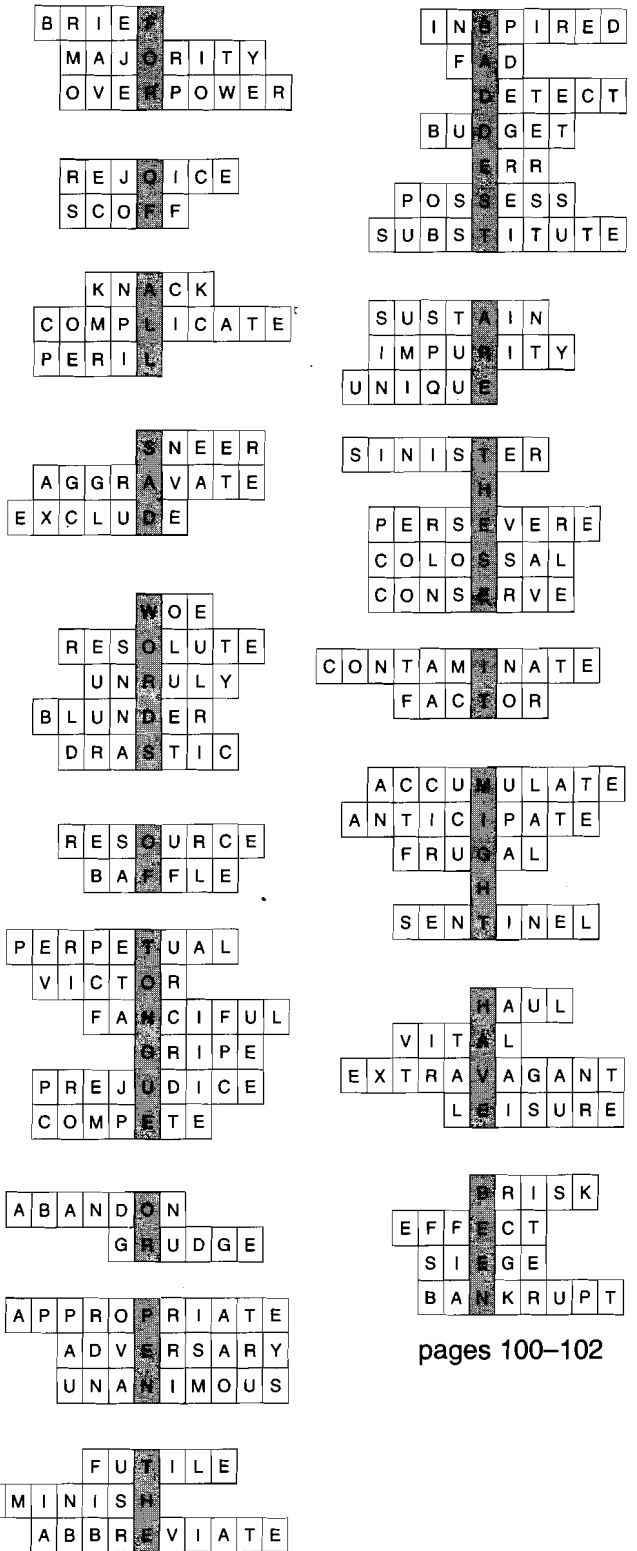
